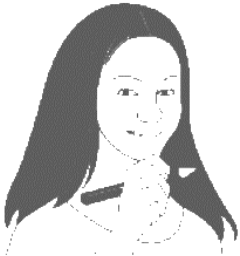

Jesse

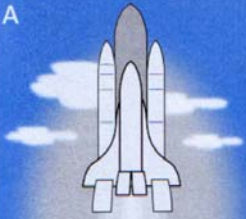

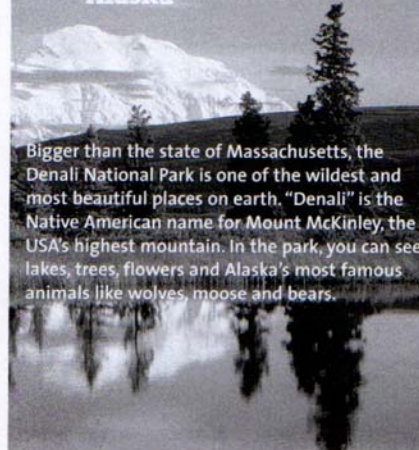
#### Amtrak's USA Rail Pass

### The National Museum of the American Indian, Washington DC



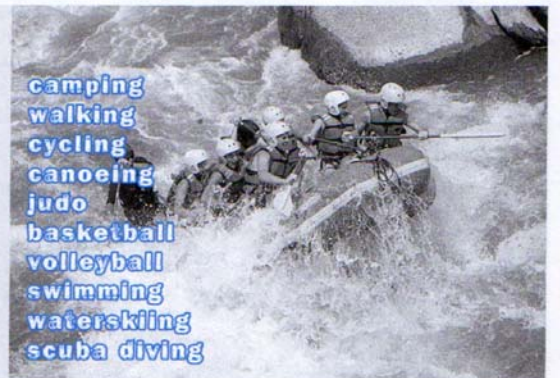
The museum opened in America's capital city in 2004. It teaches about the lives, ideas and languages of Native Americans right across the USA – in the past and today.
